CSC CHOSEN BENEFICIARY FOR INAUGURAL HONOURS GOLF CHARITY CLASSIC



Honours Golf, a Division of Troon Golf, has chosen to host its Inaugural Charity Golf Classic to benefit the Christian Service Center. Honours Golf is the management company for local golf clubs like Craft Farms Golf Resort, Peninsula Golf and Racquet Club, Emerald Greens, and several other golf clubs throughout the Southeast. This year's tournament will be held on November 2, at Peninsula Golf and Racquet Club.

When making the announcement, Area Manager for Honours Golf, Chad Leonard said, "After learning what the Christian Service Center does for our Gulf Coast community, the decision to choose it as the beneficiary for the inaugural tournament was an easy one to make.

By donating the income from this tournament, we hope to provide additional funding to continue their mission of helping people throughout Gulf Shores, Orange Beach and Fort Morgan. We are excited about partnering with the Center and look forward to presenting a large check to them on November 2."

The format for the Tournament is a four-person scramble. Prizes will be given for the top three places in both gross and net divisions. Additional prizes include longest drive, closest to the pin, and longest putt. Currently, committees are at work securing golfers, sponsors, and raffle prizes. The Tournament can accommodate 120 golfers at \$125 each. Tournament fees include lunch, drinks on the course, prizes and a tee gift. The Title Sponsor for this year's tournament is Lulu's. Here is some information our Statistician, David Saunders, recently shared with our Board of Directors.

Gee Whiz!

Since I started recording statistics eleven years ago in January 2005, here is what CSC has done. Beginning with Case 1 on January 3, 2005 through December 16, 2016, Case 176, the Center saw 19,671 clients, representing 47,922 family members, 19,776 of whom were children and 1,594 were 60+ years old.

Here's a breakdown of what has been done through financial assistance:

In addition, over this eleven year period, CSC provided 85,423 food units (food for one person for one week. ie: 21 meals per unit) for a total of 1,793,833 meals. That's enough food to feed everyone in Gulf Shores, Orange Beach, Foley, Loxley, Robertsdale, Bay Minette, and Fairhope for a week with 19,423 food units left over.* Put another way, that's enough food to feed every man, woman and child in Baldwin County (town and rural area population) 19 meals, with food left over.

It should be noted that every client who receives assistance from the Center is carefully screened to insure that the Center's mission of a HAND UP rather than a HAND OUT is being met.

BEHIND THE SCENES

The statement, "A Hand Up" rather than "A Hand Out" is a wonderful thought but what does it really mean to actually give a "Hand Up" at the Christian Service Center? Think of a hand for a moment - fingers, skin, bones, tendons, blood, tissue, nerves, etc; Part of it we see - part of it we don't. The fingers, for example – they are flexible. Together they can write, type, wave, point, grasp, and bend.

Now, think about the Food Pantry, our best known service. A cart of food is being wheeled out to load into a client's car. But before that can happen, the client must make an appointment for an interview through an Administrative Assistant. The interview is with a Case Worker who must gather needed information without making the client feel embarrassed or harassed. Information must be verified, paperwork filed, and records kept in order to achieve the end result of providing enough food to feed the family for two weeks.

Before that cart loaded with food can be rolled out to the car though, somebody had to load the cart; somebody had to organize and fill the shelves, refrigerators and freezers. Bread and other food had to be picked up or ordered in a timely manner from contributing stores or restaurants. And, when the Feeding the Gulf Coast truck rolls in on a scheduled basis, somebody had to be on hand to unload and store the items.

The Food Pantry is just one example – one finger, let's say. There's also a Medical Equipment Loan program, Grant Applications to be written and filed in a timely way, communications with other agencies through Wise Hope in order to avoid duplication of services, facilities maintenance, volunteer coordination, Ozanam medical assistance, special programs to coordinate like summer camp, the backpack program, birthday club, Meals on Wheels, accounting, record keeping, statistical data organized, filing – many, many things in the background that we don't see – just like the hand.

How can all this happen? It all works together - just like the hand. In the center of the hand is the palm. In the case of the CSC, the "palm" holding all the many services and programs together is an all-volunteer staff dedicated to carry out the Center's mission of "A Hand Up".
