For the sixth year in a row, the Church of God, a Worldwide Association met at the Orange Beach Events Center. The group desires to bless the communities where they meet, and again chose the Christian Service Center as the recipient of their

outreach. Each day of their meeting, the group collected food, household supplies, personal hygiene items, baby supplies, and cash donations for the CSC.

The CSC volunteers call the group the Visiting Angels. The gift from the Church of God, a Worldwide Association, is the single largest contribution to our food pantry – for the sixth year in a row. The group contributed 2,800 pounds of food and supplies, and their generous \$9,000 cash donation will allow the CSC to purchase more than 60,000 pounds of food from the area food bank! This contribution will be used to aid families in need in Gulf Shores, Orange Beach, and Fort Morgan and will provide hundreds of meals.

Six years ago, when the Visiting Angels held their first meeting here, they were pointed towards the CSC by a city official. We are grateful for the generosity of everyone in the group meeting here and we are also grateful to our community officials for supporting us.

A good example
of this is when an unattended slow dripping
faucet can, over time, significantly increase
the water bill. Those "little" consistent drips
are hardly any water at all, but over time,
they can really add up.

In mid-August, the Christian Service Center initiated a fund-raising project based on this concept. Stop by the CSC, and we will provide small glass jars for you to take home. Each day, consistently drip loose pocket and purse change into the jar. Over time, when the jars fill, just dump the coins in a plastic bag, and start over again. Bring the coins to the CSC or to a participating church, and the church will see that it gets to the CSC. You won't miss the small change, yet those pennies, nickels, dimes, and quarters, consistently dripped over time, will add up and truly help others in need.

Participating churches are in Gulf Shores, Fort Morgan, and Orange Beach. Jars have also been placed at the check-out counters of several commercial businesses in the area.
