We were extremely busy in 2023 at CSC as inflation and unstable employment continued to challenge low income families. We had 3,045 client visits providing food and emergency aid for 9,013 people (stats include repeat visits). We provided food to 2,699 families, feeding 8,102 people 3 meals a day for 7 days — that's food provided for 170,142 meals!

We could not do this without the incredibly generous support of the community. It continues to amaze me that we can do all of this with an all volunteer staff. I cannot thank everyone enough for their support, dedication, and hard work.

We look forward to 2024 as we continue to provide food and emergency financial assistance to families in need.

We are thankful and blessed!
